

SEXUAL ASSAULT **PREVENTION** & RESPONSE

SEXUAL ASSAULT DOES HAPPEN. EVEN IN THE RESERVES.

- 91%** of victims are E-1 to E-4
- 52%** of offenders are E-2 to E-5
- 60%** of assaults occur from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- 72%** of assaults occur in the operating forces
- 54%** of assaults occur on base
- 53%** of victims are within their first year of service
- 91%** of victims are E-1 to E-4
- 91%** of victims are E-1 to E-4


IT'S EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE IT DOESN'T HAPPEN.

- Bystander intervention**- don't be the one to let your fellow Marine be sexually assaulted, or sexually assault someone else.
- Small unit training**- Conduct small unit training with your sections as often as necessary.
- Reporting**- Report any suspicious activities to your chain of command.

BUT IF IT DOES HAPPEN, KNOW YOUR OPTIONS.


RESTRICTED REPORTING

Restricted reporting allows a Marine who is sexually assaulted to **confidentially** report the assault.



UNRESTRICTED REPORTING

Unrestricted reporting allows a Marine who is sexually assaulted to report the assault. **This is the preferred method of reporting.**
